Dear Colleagues,

Upon creating the first human being, God quickly notes (Gen. 2:18), “לא טוב היות אדם לבדו”—It is not good for this Adam to be alone.” God quickly understands that Divine presence in the world is not enough for this new creation—human beings require human companionship. Our sages take this idea further when it comes to rabbis, elevating the popular phrase quoted by Rava in the Gemara (Taanit 23a), “או חברותא או מיתותא—Companionship or death!”

As we have faced a global pandemic, our Rabbinical Assembly’s core mission, which is to connect and support rabbis, has perhaps never been more valued, or more challenging. Our colleagues have worked so hard, in every corner of the world, and in every setting, to share Torah, to create meaningful experiences, and to ensure connections within their communities. Our RA staff and lay leadership have, in turn, worked hard to do the same among our colleagues, providing the assurance that, indeed, we feel connection and companionship.

As you will see in this report, our response to the pandemic has included adaptations of halakhah by the CJLS to this unprecedented environment; new policies, training and support for career transitions; study opportunities and self-care programs; individual counseling and group processing opportunities; and so much more.

All the while, we have also continued our focus on implementing our 10 Bold Statements of our RA Vision Plan. We hired Sheryl Katzman as our Senior Director of Member Engagement and Ilana Garber as our Director of Global Rabbinic Development. Together with our existing staff, they have grown our opportunities to engage one another in a network of affinity groups, professional growth and learning initiatives, new partnerships within and outside our movement (including our deepening collaboration with USCJ), and leadership training programs.

Our membership and lay leaders have played key roles in helping us develop and evaluate responses to the pandemic, set priorities in our strategic plan implementation, develop messaging for Dover Emet advocacy, initiate new publications projects, and refine our budgeting and fundraising efforts towards greater sustainability.

It has been a year of challenge and growth, all sustained by our continued sense of connection and חברותא with one another. Thank you for your continued support of Our RA, and we wish you blessings and strength as we continue our joint work.

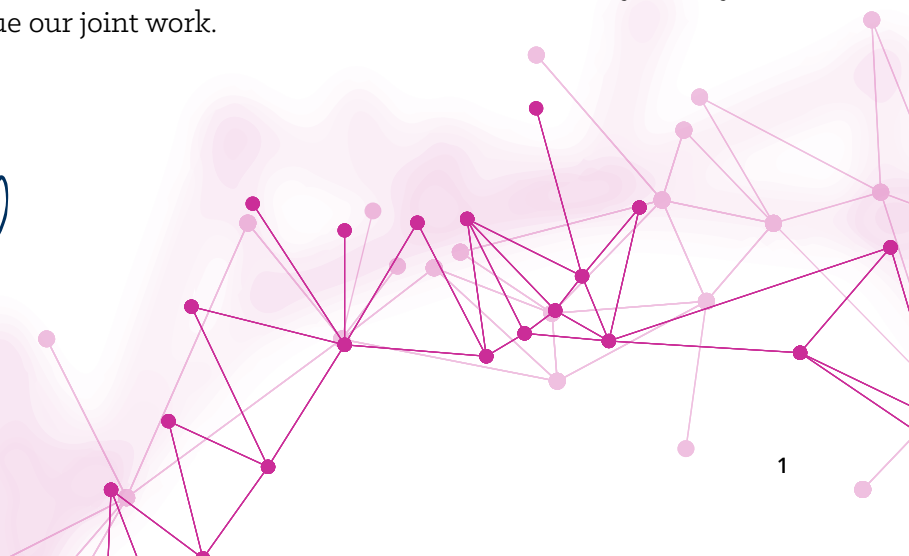

SUPPORTING AND STRENGTHENING RABBIS

During an unprecedented time marked by strict limits to in-person social gatherings, our RA programming provided a wide variety of opportunities for colleagues to connect with and support one another virtually.

Our senior consultant, Bill Lebeau, counsels **241** colleagues, ranging from a single outreach to multiple emails, phone calls, meetings and mentorship meetings.

72 new colleagues in their 1st-3rd year in the rabbinate are paired with 58 experienced colleagues through our new **Haverim** program.

22 colleagues reach out to **133** colleagues through our COVID-19 phone tree during a time of increased isolation.

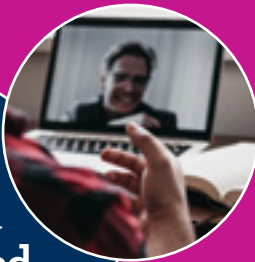


Our **Wolfe Kelman Fund** assists dozens of colleagues and their families with financial assistance.

23 colleagues regularly reach out to members experiencing illness, loss, or in need of emotional support through our Pastoral Outreach Team. In October, **550** rabbis, cantors, and partners/spouses of clergy join for 5 days of virtual events aimed to renew and refresh as Heshvan begins.

With **40** virtual classes and over **70** hours of learning, our summer learning programming attracts over **800** participants and **9** partnering institutions.



Over the summer, chaplains meet virtually for **peer-facilitated conversations** to discuss topics including death, dying and grief in a time of COVID-19, tele-chaplaincy, and caring for caregivers.

We launch **virtual affinity groups** for women and parents of children with disabilities. We pilot groups for LGBTQ+ rabbis, rabbis who podcast, and clergy partners/spouses. Learn more about how to sign up for an affinity group on our website.

We host quarterly **virtual gatherings** of members of the JTS and Ziegler classes of 2020.

From March to September, CJLS releases COVID-19 **halakhic and movement guidance** related to remote minyanim, lifecycle events, conversion, and the High Holidays.

SUPPORTING RABBIS IN CAREER DEVELOPMENT

In 2019 and 2020, we post **77** pulpit positions on our job board and 50 jobs on our organization job board.



Emily Hendel, Director of Career Services, fields phone calls from more than **300** rabbis and **150** lay leaders and hiring managers on **4** continents.

In July we release a brand-new **questionnaire** for congregations to fill out when they have open pulpit positions. We attempt to neutralize biases in the questions.



From March to June, **Our RA** participates in multiple webinars on hiring during a pandemic, including a panel discussion with representatives from USCJ, the CA, NAASE, & JEA.

In February, **20** congregations throughout the U.S. participate in Interview Week. Graduates from Ziegler and JTS attend **85** interviews over a 4-day period.

By July, **60** rabbis begin new jobs or receive promotions. Please see our list of Completed Career Advancements to congratulate your colleagues.

In the first half of the year, we enlist the help of four of our members as advisors and Placement Coaches to **support rabbis** throughout their career searches.

We release a new rabbinic search guide manual, **Netivot**, written by Elliot Schoenberg and revised by Emily Hendel, Director of Career Services.

VIRTUAL PUBLIC PROGRAMMING

To help our members and the public celebrate the High Holidays during an unprecedented time, we release several innovative programs over YouTube, including a Seder Made to Order, How to Kasher series, pre-recorded Tikkun series, Tikkun Leil Shavuot, and Selihot.

Our **Shavuot** series features **31** presenters teaching live from coast to coast and **14** pre-recorded teachers.

Our **Rosh Hashanah Seder** features text, song, ritual, and explanations to celebrate Rosh Hashanah at home.

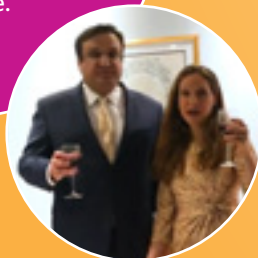
10 rabbis from Australia, Israel, North America, South America, and Europe shared introductions to **High Holiday prayers** (Divrei Tefilah).

VIRTUAL PUBLIC PROGRAMMING

Our RA website received over **500,000** pageviews from January to December 2020. Our top 10 countries were: United States, Canada, Israel, United Kingdom, Australia, Germany, India, Brazil, Argentina, and Mexico.

Our average email open rate was **53%** (up roughly 10% from 2019).

We developed a public email list with over **18,000** contacts.
