The Rabbinical Assembly is pleased to offer BRIT KODESH, a program for mohalim in the Conservative movement. Medical professionals who meet the qualifications will study a wide range of texts and traditions concerning brit milah.

## COURSES

- Introduction and overview of brit milah
- Brit milah in halakhah (rabbinic literature, Maimonides and Shulhan Arukh)
- Minhagim (customs and folklore)
- Midrash on brit milah
- Brit milah and Jewish liturgy
- Introduction and overview of Conservative Judaism
- The process of halakhah in Conservative Judaism
- Conservative Jewish responsa on brit milah

Courses will be taught by faculty members of the Jewish Theological Seminary and members of the Rabbinical Assembly.

# WORKSHOPS

- Discussions on the conflicts, confusion and risks of being both a physician and a mohel
- The psychological literature on brit milah
- Discussions on observance and personal piety
- Practicum: An experienced mohel will present a series of case studies of his most difficult or controversial circumcisions
- Practicum: With an experienced rabbi and mohel, candidates will role-play their ceremonies, presentations and explanations on brit milah, focusing on what the family will want to know and what is the best method of presentation

Workshops will be facilitated by leading Conservative rabbis, experienced *mohelim* and health professionals.

## QUALIFICATIONS

A candidate for BRIT KODESH must be:

- Recommended by a congregational rabbi
- Approved by the local Rabbinical Assembly region
- A licensed and qualified health care professional
- Clinically trained to perform neonatal medical circumcision
- Committed to the binding nature of halakhah
- Committed to the observance of mitzvot within the framework of the Conservative movement – both in the home and in the community
- Committed to Shabbat observance according to the standards of the Conservative movement
- Observant of the Jewish dietary laws according to the standards of the Conservative movement
- Committed to ongoing personal talmud Torah
- Committed to regular tefillah
- Prepared to perform brit milah only according to halakhah
